



## A message from our founder

Ascend's work in 2022 laid the foundation for our growth to new programs in Afghanistan and Pakistan in 2023, reaching thousands of people through our activities.

We spent 2022 honoring our commitment to support the 134 Afghans whom we helped to leave their country in 2021. Our priority was to help these girls build new lives legally, and with dignity. We created partnerships with generous people around the world to help them find community in 9 different countries, learn 7 new languages, and find pathways to education and jobs. But we never stopped working to deliver our program to girls in Afghanistan, and to build towards a greater impact by launching in new places.

2022 tested Ascend's agility and left us more resolute than ever in our commitment to empowering girls. When women lead, societies experience greater stability, more lasting peace, healthier families and stronger economies. It begins with investing in girls.

We are so grateful to all who made that investment in 2022. My deepest thanks to the donors and volunteers who powered this incredible year.



## 2022: An extraordinary year

### **Our Mission**

Ascend empowers girls and women through mountaineering based leadership training and community service.

The events of 2021 in Afghanistan demanded that we pause our normal programming and respond to new realities. Our mission is to help girls succeed in their communities, but when our girls asked for our help to leave Afghanistan and find a life where they could pursue an education and freedom, we stepped in to do whatever we could.

### **Our Pivot**

2022 was about following through with that commitment, while strengthening our organization to make even greater impact with our programs in 2023.

To support the 134 Afghans we helped to leave their country, we invested in partnerships with community groups around the world; created "Ascend Online" to serve those in transit; and sought mental health resources to help girls cope.

Our friends and allies around the world helped us to empower girls at a vulnerable time in their lives. We are deeply grateful to all who supported this work.



## 2022 Priorities

### Support the dignified and legal resettlement of 134 Afghans

Ascend supported the movement of 134 of our participants, alumnae, and staff members and their families in 2021. During 2022, we directed resources to provide language training, jobs placement, and pathways to education as they settled into new lives across 8 countries.

# Launch Ascend's program in a new country

As our alumnae navigated the crisis of suddenly becoming refugees and asylum seekers, many told us the skills they learned in our program were key to their resilience. This feedback fed our fire to take our program to new places. We conducted a rigorous global study to select the next location in which to establish our program. Ascend Pakistan launched in December 2022.

### 3 Establish a vibrant alumnae program

One of the many barriers holding women back from leadership roles is a lack of female networks. A vibrant alumnae program provides an inner circle of teammates who share the experience of being an Ascend team member. Through the Ascend Alumnae Association, our girls obtain support to engage in climbing, hiking, and camping that reinforces bonds and provides a helping hand to reconnect with the activities they first experienced in our program.

# Assess feasibility of resuming programming in Afghanistan


Our commitment to empowering girls in Afghanistan remained unchanged as the country experienced a dramatic change in laws and the rights of women and girls. We watched events closely and held on to our assets with the intention of resuming our program if it was feasible in 2023. Alumnae assisted with a needs assessment to help inform the program design.

## Our 2022 strategy

Ascend had to be flexible and pragmatic in 2022. Our strategy was to ethically and responsibly support people in crisis, while looking ahead to a resumption of our core progam and activities.

This meant focusing on several lines of effort simultaneously, managing the day-today tasks demanded by a crisis while undergoing strategic planning for an expansion into new places.

We focused on 8 areas to support and empower our women and girls during a time of intense transition:

- Education high school enrollment, university admissions and master's level study
- Jobs training through Ascend Online, partners, and jobs placements
- Language lessons to survive and thrive in Danish, Polish, Spanish, English, German, Kazakh, and Irish Gaelic
- **Mentoring** to navigate the hurdles thrown in front of displaced people and find pathways to success
- Costs for living rent, food, transportation provided directly and through partners
- Mental health care one-to-one counseling, group therapy, and activities to support mental health
- **Physical health & fitness** online instruction through Ascend Online, provision of climbing gear, gym passes, and bicycles
- Ascend activities to reconnect with joy: rock climbing, bouldering, physical fitness, yoga
